City Council Workshop

The City Council of the City of Springville met in a workshop meeting on Monday, July 18th, 2022, at 5:30pm and addressed the items on the agenda. Those members present were as follows:

No members were absent.

The council heard a departmental report from Asa Sargent, building inspector. Sargent stated that he was still waiting for an engineer to sign off on the plans for the new building addition to the water department that would house the building department. He also stated that all three building department employees were now CAPZO certified.

Chief Walton then asked the council to consider allowing him to hire an additional police officer to fill in the void that will be left for the next 10 months to 1 year by an officer who is on military leave.

The council then discussed the request by the Springville Community Theatre for an appropriation of \$3,000.

The council then discussed a quote to gravel the newly acquired land next to One-Eighty Church to use as a parking lot.

Lastly, the council looked over a proposed maintenance proposal from SERVCO for the heating and air conditioning units in each city building.

The workshop was adjourned at 5:55pm.

City Council Meeting

The City Council of the City of Springville met in a regular session at 6:00pm on Monday, July 18th, 2022. Mayor Dave Thomas presided, and Deputy City Clerk Kim Stone served as recording secretary.

Mayor Thomas called the meeting to order at 6:00pm. Brother Ennis gave the invocation and Mayor Thomas led the Pledge of Allegiance. Deputy Clerk Kim Stone called roll and the following officials were present:

Council member Tucker made a motion to approve the minutes from the July 6th, 2022 workshop and council meeting with a second from Vinson. There was no discussion and all present voted to approve. Motion passed.

Council member Toles made a motion to approve the agenda as revised, which included tabling the personnel handbook and pay scales, adding hiring a police officer, the Springville Community Theatre appropriation for \$3000, and approving the purchase of gravel for the new parking area, with a second from Walker. There was no discussion and all present voted yes. Motion passed.

A citizen request from Deana Evans about a need for speed bumps on Westwood Drive was on the agenda, but Ms. Evans was not present.

Council member Reaves made a motion to approve the purchase of gravel quote from Hughes Construction for up to \$31,000 with a second from Hennings. There was no discussion. All present voted yes. Motion passed.

Council member Vinson made a motion to approve the hiring of an additional police officer to backfill a position for an officer out on military leave, with a second from Tucker. There was no discussion and all present voted yes. Motion passed.

Council member Parker made a motion to approve an appropriation to the Springville Community Theatre for \$3,000 with a second from Toles. Council member Toles pointed out that there was originally \$2,500 budgeted for the theatre group. All present voted yes. Motion passed.

The council then addressed the proposed resolution to authorize speed control devices on Terry Street. Council member Walker stated that it was previously asked of the council to do the same on Crest Circle and that the council would be remiss if they didn't include Crest Circle in the proposed resolution. There was some discussion as to the cost of the additional speed control devices and their placement. Council member Toles then made a motion to approve Resolution 2022-19: A Resolution Amending the Traffic Control Devices Within the City that would authorize speed control devices on Terry Street and Crest Circle with a cost not to exceed \$10,000. Council member Vinson gave a second. There was no more discussion and all present voted yes. Motion passed.

Chief Harvey then spoke to the council on the need to adopt a Hazard Mitigation Plan put forth by the St. Clair County Commission. Council member Reaves made a motion to approve Resolution #2022-20 A Resolution Approving the 2021 Division G Regional Multi-Jurisdictional Hazardous Mitigation Plan with a second from Walker. There was no more discussion and all present voted yes. Motion passed.

Council member Reaves then made a motion authorizing the mayor to enter into a contract with SERVCO for HVAC maintenance with a second from Hennings. There was no more discussion and all present voted yes. Motion passed.

Parks and Recreation Director Rick Hopkins then told the council about an expense in the parks department to Southland Irrigation for \$18,225 to install irrigation coverage on a new field area. Council member Toles made a motion to ratify the expense with a second from Vinson. There was no further discussion and all present voted yes. Motion passed.

Council member Tucker made a motion to adjourn with a second from Toles. All present voted yes. Motion approved. Meeting adjourned at 6:36pm.
