# OCTOBER 17, 2022

## WORKSHOP:

The City Council of the City of Springville met in a workshop session on Tuesday, October 17, 2022 at 5:30 p.m. at Springville City Hall. Mayor Dave Thomas presided and City Clerk Lynn Porter served as recording secretary.

The workshop items were carried over until next meeting.

Councilmember Reaves stated she had spoken to someone at the Board of Education and thanked them for funding the SRO position in Springville and was told that the Board had not voted on this yet. She stated she understood at our last meeting where we approved hiring three SROs that the funding was in place. The Board will meet tomorrow.

Councilmember Reaves encouraged the Council and all our departments to attempt to stay within the adopted budget. When the Council approves things that are not budgeted items, they need to consider where the funding will come from and how it will impact the budget.

Councilmember Toles agreed that we need to follow the budget.

Mayor Thomas stated he spoke with Ms. Joyce Cunningham or ARC of St. Clair County about city support. He stated he offered the use of our audio/video equipment for advertising for their fundraising gala, and to promote community awareness. He asked the Council to consider whether we can help financially at some level since services are provided to a segment of Springville's adult mentally challenged population that is not otherwise served.

Mayor Thomas stated debris pickup is still a problem. He asked at what point do we invest in a grappling truck to pick up.

Councilmember Walker asked about having a lost and found box at Big Springs Park.

The Building and Zoning report was given.

The workshop was concluded.

Mayor Thomas called the meeting to order. Reverend Mike Ennis was called upon to give the invocation, followed by the pledge to the flag.

A letter of support for an Argo ATRIP II application for improvements at Argo Margaret Road and Highway 11 was introduced. Councilmember Hennings moved we send this letter of support, seconded by Councilmember Walker and the vote was unanimous.

Councilmember Reaves reminded the Council of the Mayor's breakfast.

Councilmember Hennings reminded the Council or the Paul Manning service appreciation event on Thursday.

Councilmember Toles moved the meeting be adjourned, seconded by Councilmember Hennings, and the vote was unanimous.
